



RUTES AND REGULATIONS

1. Admission: No-one, whether in charge of exhibits or otherwise, will be admitted without a ticket.
2. Entries must be accompanied by the necessary fees; other-wise they will not be accepted.
3. **All entries must be in writing accompanied by entry fees and lodged with the Chief Steward on or before the advertised closing date.**
4. All Competitors/Exhibitors under 18 years of age must be countersigned by a parent or guardian.
5. **All stallholders/Exhibitor Ground space/Competitors will abide by the Rules and Regulations of the Brighton Show.**
6. All exhibitors compete at their own risk.
7. All stock exhibits must be on the Showground and penned where applicable not later than 8.00am on the morning of the Show unless otherwise stated.
8. In NO case will exhibitors be allowed to remove their exhibits before 4pm on Sunday of Show unless permission is granted by the President or Secretary of the Brighton Agricultural show Society Inc.
9. All entries must be made on the forms supplied by the Society.
10. Withdrawal of entries must be advised to the Chief Steward no later than 8.30am on the day of the show.
11. The Society shall not in any circumstances be responsible for any loss or mis-delivery of stock or exhibits.
12. The Society will not be responsible for any accident that may be caused through or by an exhibit.
13. The Committee will afford every possible facility to exhibitors, and every care will be taken of exhibits, but no responsibility will be incurred by the Society.
14. The Society reserves itself the right of refusal of any entry and to delete or postpone or combine any section or class or part of it.
15. Any dispute as to the interpretation of the rules, bylaws or provisions shall be determined by the BAS Executive Committee, whose decision shall be final,
25. The judges have the power to withhold or not issue a place if in their opinion the exhibit is not of the required standard, or does not conform to the requirements of the classes as described in the schedule.
26. Should any exhibit, having gained a prize, be disqualified the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The BAS Executive Committee, with or without the advice of the Judge, shall decide the question.
27. No second prize will be paid unless three (3) or more entries are received in that class, unless the prize is sponsored.
28. The BAS is under no obligation to provide space for exhibits or accommodation for people accompanying the exhibits. However, if the BAS, in its discretion, does allocate space for exhibits or space for people to sleep, exhibits may be placed and people may sleep only in the areas allocated for such purposes by the BAS and fill out an "On Site Form" and comply with Security and BAS rules and regulations and pass out/in to access site
29. If, in the opinion of the BAS Executive Committee, any exhibit or exhibits of stock/birds be deemed to be dangerous, or a source of infection or contagion to any livestock, birds (poultry /pigeon) or persons, the owner of such exhibit or exhibits shall immediately upon notice to that effect, remove such exhibit or exhibits from the Society's ground or building.
30. Only birds that have been entered for exhibit are allowed for sale, birds that are not entered under the Poultry or Pigeon section are not to be for sale and will be asked to leave site.
31. Young birds are those hatched since 1't July, in the year preceding the Show.
32. All exhibits must be bona fide property of the exhibitor at date of entry.
33. All exhibits must be correctly classed, and age specified, under risk of disqualification, and no poultry/pigeon will be allowed to be shown with rings on
34. The Society is empowered to exclude any bird which is not in a fit state for exhibition, either from disease or any other causes the, the entrance fee on which will be forfeited.

Rules and regulations- continues

35. All birds must be penned by 8.00am day of Show or they will be too late for judging. The Society provides coops for all classes of poultry and pigeons and will attend to the exhibits during the Show. All eggs will be destroyed.

36. The Society will be most anxious for care and safety of the poultry and pigeons sent for exhibition or any other property entrusted to them, but it must be distinctly understood by exhibitors and all other persons that the Society will not be responsible for the loss, detention of, or damage to any of the poultry, pigeons or other property, whether arising from accident or other causes whatsoever, or from any act or omission of themselves, their agents, officers, servants or other.

37. The term cock shall mean all male birds over 12 months old, on 1st June preceding the Show. Hen, all female birds over 12 months on 1st June preceding the Show.

38. Wrongly classed birds will not be reclassified on the day.

39. Poultry & Pigeon carry boxes to be removed from pavilion for duration of show.

40. **PLEASE NOTE:** IT IS THE EXHIBITORS RESPONSIBILITY TO HOLD THEIR OWN PUBLIC LIABILITY INSURANCE.

41. The Brighton Agricultural Society Inc. Collects personal information from exhibitors in competitions conducted by the Society. Verification of the accuracy of this data may be obtained through contact with the BAS Secretary. This information is used only for the purpose related to the conduct of the events run by the Society and is not divulged to third parties. However, entrant's names and contact details may be released to health and safety. The names of exhibitors may be included in catalogues published by the Society and successful exhibitor's names released for general publication. If you do not provide the information required on the competition entry form we may not be able to accept your entry.

42. The BAS is under no obligation to provide space for exhibits or accommodation for people accompanying the exhibits. However, if the BAS, in its discretion, does allocate space for exhibits or space for people to sleep, exhibits may be placed and people may sleep only in the areas allocated for such purposes by the BAS. Any personal belongings, equipment or property brought by Exhibitors, their employees or families, to the Pontville Recreation Grounds must be kept in the accommodation area which may be allocated by the BAS for storage purposes. (Please contact the BAS Secretary, a Camping Registration Form MUST be filled out).
